## **1. The aims and objectives of the conference program**

The international situation in the modern world is assessed as unstable. The instability is affecting Western Europe countries as well. For the countries of Central and Eastern Europe, the problem of military and economic destabilization is often combined with the real threat to the state and national existence.

The aim of the conference is to present the latest research results, exchange of experience and dissemination of the views of academics and practitioners on the various aspects of the collective security and the development of an integrated Europe. It is therefore necessary to carry out multilateral hazard analysis in the context of administrative practices and on the background of legal aspects of safety management of the state. An attempt to identify threats and formulating hypotheses relating to methods of their minimization or elimination, should be taken as well.

## **2. The thematic areas of the conference**

### *2.1. Military threats:*

- prognosis associated with the likelihood of armed conflict in Europe;
- new strategies of war, with particular emphasis on asymmetric conflicts and hybrid war;
- contemporary European security policy in the context of military threats;
- protection of national security and public order in case of imminent threat of armed conflict (case studies).

### *2.2. Non-military threats:*

- the safety of the banking system in a crisis situation; financial risk management;
- abuses in the country's economy key enterprises (sectors);
- security of sensitive data in the economy, protection against deliberate and unconscious releasing the data in the process of business communication;
- corruption risks in the country's economy key enterprises (sectors);
- economic intelligence and counterintelligence;
- energetic safety;
- security audits in the country's economy key enterprises (sectors);

- maritime safety and the maritime economy security;
- the safety in transport and logistics;
- responsibilities of government to ensure the safety in case of an emergency;
- the activities of the security services in the face of terrorist threats;
- natural disasters;
- environmental security;
- epidemiological safety;
- cyber-security, cyber terrorism;
- information warfare, disinformation strategies, the media in a crisis situation;
- contemporary problems of economic war;
- education for safety.

- basic civil liberties in the context of the need to ensure a sense of security of civic community;
- humanitarian crises as the seeds of further conflicts;
- security of the state in the assumptions of European migration policy.
